

Death Penalty May Be Removed In New York

ALBANY, N.Y. (AP) — The mandatory death penalty was on the way out in New York State today in a move that could lead to abolition of capital punishment in the state.

The bill sets up a two-stage trial procedure that will permit jurors to decide first whether an accused person is guilty and, if so, then to determine whether he should be put to death. It will apply to trials begun after July 1.

According to the latest figures, the average age of our World War One veterans is about 85 years. There are a little over 1 million left. We're very happy to say that for the most part they are in good health.

Chances are, the veteran will be called in for a physical examination by the VA. However, if the veteran is unable to travel to the examination station, the VA will send a physician to his home.

In addition, any veteran who receives compensation for a service-connected disability, and who can meet certain requirements, may be entitled to an increase in compensation.

It is very gratifying indeed to know that somewhere in this state there is someone with the courage and stamina to stand up for law and order and justice for all.

It is my hope that you will be able to get the necessary information from the VA office in your area.

Zoos Plan Animal Farms To Save Rarest Species

Like Noah, zoo keepers are building their own ark to save threatened species of the wild. The Bronx Zoo in New York plans to start 100-acre breeding farms for rare animals this year.

Not long ago, zoos could draw upon seemingly endless reserves of wild animals. Now, zoos are becoming sanctuaries for fast-vanishing game.

Washington's National Zoological Park, explains, "Every city zoo emphasizes variety. We keep more than 700 species here. That means small enclosures. We can do pretty well with cats and bears and small mammals, but not with animals like cattle. To breed them you need herds. And what zoo can keep 30 giraffes or elands?"

Zoo experts believe it will become necessary to raise animals in large areas designed for scientific breeding rather than exhibition each year, zoos would operate more like livestock farms than a city zoo.

Two prize exhibits—the European bison, or wisent, and Pere David's deer (14) of the nearly extinct white-tailed deer of South Africa—of the 80 known Przewalski horses, only surviving species of wild horses, and the rarest of all sub-species of zebra, Mrs. Hartmann's zebra.

Certain species of American wildlife have been saved by setting aside breeding areas. The Hawaiian goose, or nehe, which dwindled from 25,000 in 1882 to a single bird in 1907, recovered because captive pairs were bred in Hawaii and Britain.
