Colbert veterans organizations pledge their support of the Colbert County Veterans Day celebration which is to be held Nov. 11, at a meeting held Sunday night at the Legion Home, Tuscumbia.
 The meeting, called by Judge James Tompkins, general chairman of the celebration, was attended by representatives of a number of VFW posts and auxiliaries of Sheffield and Tuscumbia, the Negro American Legion Post of Tuscumbia, Sheffield's National Guard unit, the Cootee and Coedette organizations of Sheffield, the Muscle Shoals 40 and 82 district chairman of the American Legion, and the Gold Star Mothers of Sheffield.
 Plans call for the participation of the Deebler, Sheffield, Sterling and Tremblin bands, Town Creek and Leighton bands have also been invited.
 The parade is scheduled to begin at 11 a.m. at Fifth and Broad Streets, Tuscumbia, and proceed to North Montgomery Ave. Sheffield High School and other entertainment is scheduled at the F.W. Hall, Sheffield, on the night of Nov. 11.
 All civic organizations, Boy and Girl Scouts and city officials of Sheffield and Tuscumbia will be invited to enter a float in the parade. Merchants will be asked to display their flags on the 11th, and witness the celebration.
