The traveling Home and Farm Electrical Exposition ended its highly successful six month tour of the TVA area on Nov. 1 at Centre, Ala.

The Exposition followed a 3,000 mile route in four states, stopping at 51 towns. Top attendance was at Tupelo, Miss., where 21,500 turned out for a two-day showing.

Plans are already underway for another Exposition tour in 1951. The Exposition was sponsored by the Tennessee Valley Public Power Association.

A \$1,824,000 construction program to provide for the rapidly expanding need for electric service in the Sand Mountain area in Alabama has been under way since the middle of this year.

Construction notes: All work at the Johnsonville Station in West Tennessee is on schedule; electrical progress was made during the summer.

Sheffield Garden Club Asks Planting Annual Rye Grass

The Sheffield Garden club is sponsoring the planting of annual rye grass this autumn.

Certain public spirited citizens have donated quantities of this seed already, and arrangements have been made to have this planted on parks and places throughout the city.

All persons who would like to help "dress Sheffield up" for the winter and spring months are invited to bring or send their donations of rye grass seed to J. R. Appleton, superintendent of parks, at Oakwood Cemetery in Sheffield.

Rye grass average 15 cents per pound and a pound covers 200 square feet of ground. Purchased in 100 pound sacks, it usually sells for 12 to 2 cents per pound and is delivered by the local seed stores.

Mr. Appleton urges that care be taken in purchasing only annual rye grass seed, the kind which is crowded out by other grasses the year round and cannot be successfully mowed in the summer. This letter is to be avoided as an interference with the regular growth of our summer Bermuda grass.

A special effort is being made at this time to brighten the appearance of all public thoroughfares and parks in Florence.

The Garden club asks that Sheffield citizens co-operate in this. Donations will be promptly acknowledged.
