Not in Use of Cotton Acreage? Report Surplus

Any farmer who will not plant his cotton allotment in 1955 should allocate his acreage to the Lauderdale county office as soon as he is certain that he will not plant cotton, according to A. H. Barnett, county agent.

The reasons are as follows: stated Mr. Barnett: Lauderdale county will continue to lose cotton acreage unless the planted acres are kept up to 90 percent of the farm allotment. Lauderdale County has 31,000 acres of cotton to plant during 1955.

When allotments are given to other farmers it holds individual allotment as it is for 1956, unless the farmer fails to plant cotton in 1955 and 1956, said Mr. Barnett.
