BIRMINGHAM, Ala. — Police said a 25-year-old man who was identified with the help of a sketch drawn by his housewife victim was held on rape charges today.
Police Chief Clyde V. Sellers of Fairfield said the accused man, Eddie Thomas, a Birmingham Negro, had admitted dragging the woman from her house and criminally attacking her.
Name of the woman was withheld. She viewed pictures of several

hundred possible suspects and se-
lected several. Then she made a
sketch of her attacker.
