Road to Paganism

THERE can be only one excuse for the complacency with which a vast segment of the people of this country view the spread of communism. They don't know what it is and they underestimate its danger to every individual and the ideology and way of life we have chosen for our own in these United States.

Hitler's fascism was a political theory. The communism of Marx and Stalin is not only political, it is a religion as opposed to the Christian religion as it is possible to imagine. Communism denies the dignity of a man or of the family as the unit for which the state functions; it bars the practice of any Christian religion.

All of western Europe and the western hemisphere maintain governments and civilizations based on the Christian philosophy of Jesus Christ. Our own government is based on this religion, not because it is a political theory but because it is a religion which endangers the foundations of Christianity and Christian civilization as we know it.

Pope Pius has recognized the danger to Christianity in denying the sacraments of their church to Catholics who prefer communism, not because it is a political theory but because it is a religion which endangers the foundations of Christianity and Christian civilization as we know it.

Communism is the road back to paganism. There can be no inalienable rights of man. Communism, therefore, there can be no justice with the consent of the governed under communism; there can be no Baptist, Methodist, Episcopalian, Christian Science or Catholic churches; there can be no free elections; no such philosophy as men being created equal. Most world leaders recognize only its dangers politically as moving relentlessly and aggressively to grab government. Political and military leaders who think, see communism breeding in hate and intolerance and capturing men's minds and souls as well as their political freedom.

The chances are that the first thing the Sixty congress will take up when it convenes next January is an income tax law putting back on the books the taxes which this congress, as a so-called "most world" in an election year, took off. So if you don't have to spend that tax cut you received, save it and you'll have it to pay back next January.

Constitutional Rights

THE chance is not going to give the chorus of predictions that President Truman will not be renominated or that he will withdraw from the race for renomination. It would be like him to withdraw voluntarily if he believed the country demanded it, but he will not quit under fire.

He offended some 1,500,000 Jewish voters perhaps, when he realized that it would take American boys to defend partition of Palestine, that we didn't have the nerve to send that congress never would agree to it and that it likely would also bring Russian troops where this country didn't want them but he balked over all foreign policy. So he sought to rectify a mistake.

He offended the governors and professional politicians from seven southern states when he balked at the constitution of the United States, his own party platform and decisions of the supreme court on civil rights.

The President thinks there should be an anti-lynch law, an anti-poll tax law as a requisite for voting, and a permanent fair employment practices law to prevent "unfair" discrimination. And he thinks that segregation or Jim Crowism should be eliminated on interstate transportation lines, not just bus and street cars. The supreme court has held that segregation on interstate transportation lines is unconstitutional. The Constitution gives the poll tax as a voting condition.

Again the Constitution says: "... No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of any citizen of the United States; nor shall any state deprive any person of life, liberty or property without due process of law, nor deny to any person within its jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws." That's pretty clear and takes care of lynching and unfair discrimination.

Electoral System

The move to amend the Constitution with regard to presidential elections is gathering steam and direct vote of the people for president may become a reality. In addition to making the electoral vote of 531 electors proportional to ballots cast, there is sentiment to divide electors among states in the same proportion. For instance, Wisconsin and Georgia with almost identical populations have 12 electoral votes each. But Wisconsin casts a million more votes.

Zechariah Pleads For Righteousness

Lesson for April 25, 1948

Z ECHARIAH almost certainly was born and reared in or near Babylon, and was trained for the priesthood and ordained of the Lord as a prophet. His father, Berechiah, was the son of Iddo, the prophet. Though much sadder than Haggai a few months later than Haggai—a ministry which was to sum up the people to righteousness as a condition essential in the rebuilding of the temple and in cleansing themselves of idolatry, which were to throw off the yoke of their foes. The student will need to read the entire Book of Zechariah to have the background for this lesson. Also Psalm 24-1-6.

LIVING TOGETHER IN GOD'S WAY

TURN ye unto me, saith the Lord of hosts, and I will turn unto you," Zechariah 1-3. People cannot live together in peace and harmony unless they are united in speaking terms with God. The insidious onslaught of secularism was weakening the Jews at the very moment when they needed to be strengthened and united for the task of rebuilding the temple and restoring their life in Jerusalem.

Read further into the prophecy of Zechariah and note the admonitions of the Lord for kindness one toward another—kindness and understanding and sincerity, which were the indispensable qualities of community life.

WHAT MAKES A PEOPLE GREAT?

Z ECHARIAH reminds the people that the downfall of their fathers had been due to their forgetfulness of God. "What makes a nation great and strong? Not brick, nor stone, nor wood, But justice, love and brotherhood."

GOD HAS A STANDARD

READ chapter seven, verses 8-14 and 8:1-17, for some of the standards which God sets up for his people. "Execute true judgment, and show kindness and compassion every man to his brother. Oppress not the widow, the orphan, the foreigner, or the poor, and never plot evil in your hearts against one another."

GOD IS TO BE SOUGHT UNTO

THE first eight chapters of Zechariah have to do with the essential qualities of life if the people are to rebuild the temple. The last six chapters deal with the general standards of life which we must accept and strive to attain if we are to be well-pleasing unto him.

It is not enough to rebuild the temple. God wanted his people to become living stones of integrity and fidelity in the city of God. This we shall attain only if we seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness—constantly seek this daily walk with the Lord, in the light of his truth.

New Synthetic Ingredient Keeps Bread Fresh Longer

Bread, so often called the staff of life, forms part of nearly every meal and is relied upon by everyone for its health-giving qualities. Its tendency to become stale quickly.

This tendency towards quick staling now has been reduced by one-third, scientists claim, by introduction of this ingredient, whether in the bakery or the housewife's kitchen, will save many dollars for each American family that throws the stale end of the loaf into the garbage bucket. Incidentally, this discovery also may go a long way towards the grain-saving needed to feed the starving people of Europe.

All you do—and all the baker does—is to add a small part of a new, edible fatty substance made of synthetic ethylene oxide, to the regular bread recipe.

If use of the new substance becomes widespread, it is expected to mean that home bakers will need to bake only once or twice a week, that customers need to buy bread only a few times a week instead of daily, that restaurants no longer will stock up on bread in tremendous amounts and that bakeries no longer may need night-shift work to provide fresh bread.

European Refugee Camps

In the zones of the western allies in Germany there are roughly 35,000 European refugees. In the British zone and 2,000 in the French zone. Every individual is housed in a separate barracks, and consequently several families often have to live in the same room. Most of the camps are housed in disused military barracks, only a few of them consisting of ordinary dwelling-houses with normal-sized rooms. There is no place left for the very poorest of the refugees. It is really only a place in which to sleep.

2,500 Year Quest

Leading thinkers, scholars and scientists have been seeking to determine the correct size and shape of the earth ever since the time of the Greek philosopher, Pythagoras, who expounded his theories on the earth as a sphere about 550 B. C. One of the first to measure the earth was the first known writer to describe and apply a method for using the sun as a measuring tool to get more information on the earth's size and shape. Theodorus the American, John F. Haynes of the coast and geodetic survey, early in the 1900's generally are conceded to be the most precise yet obtained in the 2,500 year quest.

Experiment With Hops

Gregory's crop of hops was cut about one-third last year by mildew. In an effort to cut down this loss, 40,000 English hop cuttings were planted in an experiment to eliminate mildew from hop fields. Cuttings were taken from English hybrid hops. The hop is a climbing plant, cultivated for the sake of its cones, which contain a bitter substance and are used for brewing in imparting an agreeable flavor to beer. Duration of the plant varies from 15 or 20 years to an indefinite length of time.

Retarding Potato Sprouts

A problem commonly encountered by farmers and homemakers is that potatoes sprout and shrivel long before stored in warm temperatures. Another problem is that when stored at temperatures below 40 degrees potatoes will become sweet, and warming them for use or cooking at temperatures of 70 to 75 degrees will diminish this sweetness. The chemical with a long involved name, methyl ester of alpha-naphthyl acetic acid, is the most effective substance for retarding potato sprouts.
