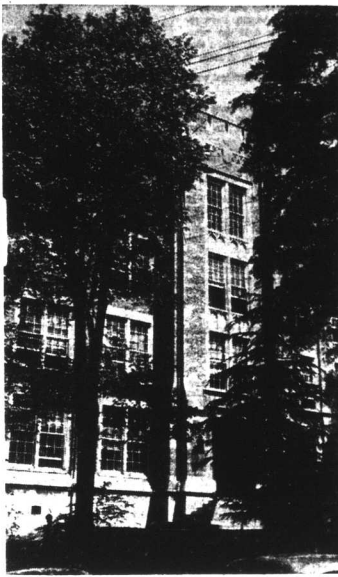

Negroes May Be Forced Out Rural Georgia--Harris

AUGUSTA, Ga. (AP)—Political leader Roy Harris (formeres) attempts to force Negroes from the State's rural counties if a suit to abrogate segregation in Atlanta schools is successful.

Harris does not say exactly how many Negroes will be driven from the State, but he says that Negroes could be dispersed with on the farms of Georgia more readily than at any other time in the history of the State.

Harris, who is one of Gov. Herman Talmadge's chief advisers, adds: "Our informant says that in some few communities practically all the farmers have entered into the agreement and are now devising ways to get State money to finance the drive to the purpose of securing the same agreement everywhere x x x."

Proposal Supply Natural Gas To 55 Cities Eyed

AP Special Washington Service WASHINGTON (AP)—A Power Commission hearing on a proposal to supply natural gas to some 55 cities and towns in South Carolina, Florida, Georgia and Alabama was scheduled to resume today with cross examination.

The hearing was resumed Sept. 26 after completion of direct testimony by Atlantic Gulf Gas Co. and United Gas Pipeline Co., subsidiaries of United Gas Corp. of Shreveport, La. Southern Natural Gas Co. of Birmingham, Ala. also has applied to serve the same area but has not offered testimony on the grounds that it does not have the gas.

The hearing has been underway for more than a year with recesses from time to time. Testimony was taken here as well as in Tallahassee, Fla. and Savannah, Ga. The case, after being concluded early this year, was ordered reopened for additional evidence last week.

Higher Price Tags Are Due On Ladies' Clothes

Increased Costs Are Not Reflected In The Present Prices, Claim

NEW YORK, (AP)—The woman shopper is likely to find that price tags next Spring on house dresses, diapers, sheets, pajamas, spring hats being announced and those being prepared all reflect the increased costs of fibers and other materials, and wage boosts recently granted in both the suppliers and processors industries.

Some companies however are reported still holding up their spring goods which they believe the Korean war—goods made of less costly materials than their suppliers'—will be next spring to please most consumers really get a glimpse of their suppliers' happenings since June.

Makers of house dresses say that \$2.99 numbers are likely to sell for \$3.98 next spring. Some are hoping to market a \$2.98 dress then, but it will be made from a cheaper cloth.

Diaper producers are opening their books for most of the year at prices 3 to 11 per cent higher than now being paid by the retailer, and 15 to 20 per cent above what was paid before the Korean war.

Women's rayon and cotton pajamas are expected to follow the upward price trend. Many companies say the rise for the various quality grades will be from one price bracket to the next highest.

They report fabrics up by 35 to 50 per cent, cases up, trimmings, thread, wrapping paper and general operating costs up. The trade vision has created a marked demand for lining fabrics.

Underwear mills seem more doubtful about what to do with their price lists, but they based on replacement costs of yarn they are per cent more when they opened their spring books the end of this month. But fear of price resistance seems stronger in this field and many believe that only five per cent price rises are warranted.

Meanwhile, today one textile mill announces an increase in the wholesale price of bed sheets, averaging about \$2.85 a dozen. And a hosiery mill will raise the wholesale price of its nylon, by 5 cents to \$1.05 more a dozen.

He is the husband of Pauline McAllister, of 605 Courtland avenue, Sheffield, and the son of Mr. and Mrs. William McAllister of 1508 28th street, Sheffield. He was associated with the local unit for over three years before being called to active duty.

The Frybarger is a destroyer escort which saw escort duty in the Atlantic and convoy duty in the Pacific during the war, after having been built at Bay City, Mich., and commissioned on May 18, 1944 at New Orleans. She was placed in inactive status as part of the Florida group of the Atlantic Reserve fleet in January, 1947.
