Cost-Of-Living

Index Near All-Time Peak Again
 WASHINGTON, (AP)—The government's cost of living index inched up again last month, bringing to a fraction of a point of the peak reached in August and September, the Bureau of Labor Statistics reports that its index on Sept. 15, after dropping 0.3 of a point in a month, stood at 173.8. That means that it is 73.8 per cent above the average level in 1925-39.

The Sept. 15 level was just 1/2 per cent below the record high reached in the Fall of 1941. It was 2 1/2 per cent higher than the level of a year ago.

The bureau announced, meanwhile, that it is revising its method of computing the consumers price index in an effort to get a truly representative market basket.

The bureau does not claim that its index is a completely accurate measure of the cost of living. It is compiled rather from prices paid in major cities by moderate income families for items which go into the average budget.

The changes now under way the bureau said are designed to take account of changing buying patterns following the outbreak of the Korean war.

Although there was an overall rise in the index for Sept. 15, the bureau reported that food costs had gone down 0.2 per cent during the previous month. That drop was more than offset by increases in the prices of home furnishings, clothing, fuel and other items.
