**NEW YORK (AP)—**The Dun & Bradstreet wholesale food index this week turned upward for the first time in six weeks, rising to 86.50 from 86.48 a week ago.  
A year ago, the index was 136 per cent lower at 62.72.  
The index represents the total cost of a wholesale of a pound each of 31 foods in general use.

**Tires Hiked Fifth Time This Year**

**AKRON, O. (AP)—**Goodyear Tire and Rubber Co. today increased prices on automobile, truck and farm tires 7 1/2 per cent.  
Prices of inner tubes made of the same amount of rubber were increased by the same amount, and wide sidewall tires were jumped up 10 per cent.  
Increased cost of natural rubber, rayon, cotton and other materials is responsible for the increase, the company said. It was the fifth this year.  
Other tire-building firms declined to comment on their plans, but are expected to announce similar price hikes soon.
