

# Communists, Fascists Join Hands in Italy - Moscow Gets Bolder in West Europe

ROME—NEA—While Italian communists are anxiously scanning headlines, the Communist Party in Moscow is feverishly preparing for the conquest of power in the western countries, particularly explosive situations in Italy where Communist Fascists are reported to have secured recently a secret pact of liberation.

These observers of Soviet strategy in the hand of the Cominform in latest spectacular news reports from Italy, especially its left wing, are said by mysterious leaders and agents from mysterious sources, left wing of the Italian Social Movement is rapidly gaining adherents among the unemployed and promotionalist students in the Cominform, they are said to be advocating the nationalization of industry. Colbert, Lauderdale To Have Third Program in Alabama

Today one half of the population of the Tri-Cities area is dependent on a commercial eating establishment. This remarkable figure has brought the Tri-Cities to the third largest industry in the U. S. Due to such a rapid growth, our food handlers in sanitation and service to meet this great demand. The state has agreed to inaugurate a program for training all persons connected with food handling.

In Alabama we have been a program for a Food Handlers' Training School that will be of great value to the community as a whole. The first program in the state was worked out in Birmingham by Mrs. P. H. McFarland with the sponsorship of the City Board of Education, the State Vocational Industrial Board, and in cooperation with the County Board of Health. Now Colbert and Lauderdale are working with the instructors in Birmingham and Tusculoo, and studied their program. As soon as the program is set up she will have a meeting with the managers of all the eating establishments in the area and explain the course to them and work out a schedule whereby they can get the school for all night courses.
