Navy Guns Hold Off Red Chinese In Withdrawal

Tenth Corps Draws Into Narrow Defense Belt Around Hungnam

TOKYO, Sunday, (AP)—American forces in Northeastern Korea methodically withdrew from their disintegrating beachhead around the escape port of Hungnam Saturday, abandoning demolition of Hamhung to an onrushing tide of Chinese Communists.

Chinese patrols occupied Hamhung on time industrial and railway center six miles inland from Hungnam, shortly after U. S. Army engineers blew the last three bridges leading from the city late Saturday afternoon.

Associated Press correspondent from Hamhung reported that about 100,000 or more Chinese perched on snow-clad hills overlooking the shrinking beachhead from three sides were exerting "no great pressure."

Artillery aimed on the beachhead rim and within the Hungnam city limits roared a constant barrage at the surrounding Chinese.

Guns of the fleet standing off Hungnam heaped hell on the Reds at sea.

Carrier-based fighter planes struck through snow and low haze as Chinese columns moving down on the tightening U. N. lines.

A small force of Chinese tried to enter Hamhung Saturday before demolition squads finished wrecking the city's rail and highway bridges and its buildings of military importance. These premature Reds were chased out of town by American and American patrols of the U. S. Third Infantry Division.

With the 31st, told to report Jan. 16, will go the 10th Air Corps Group, the 10th A. A. W. Battalion under the command of Col. William H. Cromwell.

Three batteries of the battalion located in Florence, and Tusculum will answer the call. They are headquarters battery commanded by Capt. Herbert Jones; A battery, led by Capt. Frank R. Mark; both in Florence, and B battery, under the command of Lt. Bob Stevens, in Tusculum.

The medical detachment is commanded by Lt. Leonard J. Nix. Staff officers are Maj. Vernon S. Brown, executive officer; Maj. Edward H. Smoot, plans and training; Capt. Clyde R. Garrison, adjutant; and Capt. Atticus B. Harrison, supply officer.

BIRMINGHAM (AP)—The 31st Dixie Division, composed largely of Alabamians, will report for active duty Jan. 16.

The division, which fought its way with high honor through the Pacific campaign during World War II, was formally alerted Friday night. It will train at Ft. Jackson, S. C.

At the same time, the government called up the 47th National Guard Infantry Division in Minnesota and North Dakota. This division will train at Camp Rucker, near Ozark, Mo.

The 31st is composed of two regimental combat teams based in Alabama, and a third in Mississippi. The Dixie's commanding general, Maj. Gen. Alexander G. Paxton, Florence, Miss., issued this statement:

"We feel it is a heritage of every American to take up arms for his country in times of stress. We are proud that we have been selected because of our record in World War II."

The deputy commander, Brig. Gen. Walter J. Cracker, Hanna, Birmingham, was chosen recently by Alabama Gov. elect Gordon Persons as State Adjutant General.
